



A2. High Table Dinners

High-table Dinners (HTD) originated from the formal dinner tradition in Britain's prestigious boarding schools and higher academic institutions with a long history. They are vividly illustrated in the movie series "Harry Potter" with students wearing gowns, attending a grand formal dinner after the speech of their school master. The values of HTD are that it fosters a sense of shared identity among students and provides an opportunity for community leaders and renowned people in town to share their life experience. It also enables the students to practice social skills, proper table manners, and people networking.



As a major college function, HTDs at SPC are organized normally twice a semester. It is our hope that Shiu Pongers (SPCers), through participating in HTD under an elegant and refreshing ambience, will achieve the following:

- to feel at ease in attending formal social functions and to become wellversed in social and dining etiquettes, which will be beneficial for their career development;
- to learn to break the ice in interacting/communicating with High Table guests or guests at their table (Table Guests) and other unfamiliar SPCers as an enhancement of their social skills;
- to get insights from the speech or success story delivered by the invited speakers;
- to cherish the precious opportunity of learning from fellow SPC students and interacting with them while enjoying the dinner.

Social Etiquette at HTD:

As the saying goes, "good manners will open doors that the best education cannot." The HTD is perhaps an epitome of one of the most important social rituals that each and every university student should have some knowledge and experience of before they enter into society. All the etiquette and formalities allow the students to have a "taste" of socializing in a formal setting.

- Be punctual.
- Stand up and shake hands with guests when greeting them.
- Dress up properly—Formal or Lounge-suit (i.e. a matching jacket and trousers/skirt for office work) is recommended for HTD and similar formal occasions.
- Never put things other than food or tableware, e.g. spectacles, handbag, etc., on the table.
- Show respect to the speaker by stopping all activities in progress (e.g. eating or talking).

(B) Seminars, Talks and Workshops (One-all)

They are delivered by well-known scholars and experts. They help students broaden knowledge frontiers, enhance personal growth, enrich cultural experience and develop learning skills.

RC COURSE IN SPC: CPED 1000 (1 CREDIT)

CPED 1000 is officially named as "Residential College Experiential Learning". It is a Compulsory Major (CM) course at the University of Macau (UM), introducing the relevance of experiential learning in terms of the 5 core competencies emphasized in the university's residential college (RC) education system: Interpersonal Relationship and Team Work, Leadership and Service, Healthy Living, Cultural Engagement, and Citizenship with Global Perspectives.

In CPED 1000, students should participate in games or activities initiated by themselves and reflect on their experience of participation in the form of class discussion and group report. Students will also be introduced to electronic portfolio system (Mahara) to keep evidence of their experiential learning and to share their experience and personal reflection. It is a UM requirement that each RC student must complete this course with a passing grade before graduation.

COURSE SUPPORTED BY SPC: CPED 1001, CPED 1002 AND CPED 1003

Students should attend enough activities related to physical exercise in RC in order to pass Physical Education (CPED 1001 and CPED 1002) which is handled by Faculty of Education.

Students should also attend enough activities related to communication and leadership in RC in order to pass CPED 1003 which is handled by Faculty of Social Sciences.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

As an integral part of the University of Macau graduation requirements under the 4-in-1 education model, "Community and Peer Education" is required of for all undergraduate students. For the educational benefits of individual students and the entire residential community, all SPC students are expected to actively participate in college activities, as part of the graduation requirements. Student performance in activity participation and E-portfolio writing will be tracked. Students should meet these requirements before graduation. As SPC students, if you fail to meet the specific requirements, such as attending High Table Dinner, you should make it up in the following year.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Move In / Out Procedures

MOVE IN PROCEDURES

- 1. Approach the move-in counter of the SPC General Office move-in counter;
- 2. Present your student ID card/offering letter;
- 3. Complete the SPC Move-in Acknowledgement form and submit a 1.5 inch/2 inch recent photo.
- 4. Pick up your room key card and room equipment checklist;
- 5. Return the room equipment checklist within 3 days after moving in.
- 6. Remark: The record of utilities of each room will be posted in the common area of each floor on the morning of August 13. It will be considered as the initial reading for calculating your utility fees if you move in during the annual mass move-in period.

MOVE OUT PROCEDURES

UM regulations require all first-year students to reside in the college and actively participate in college activities there. For upper class students (year-2 to year-4), all requests for moving out of college during the academic year will be considered on a case-by-case basis and be subject to final approval by the respective College Master in the academic year 2019/20.

2. Staff from the General Office will check the conditions of the room and record the electricity (and/or water) meter readings for excess usage charge. The

The college office will issue a new resident card to you during office hours. For replacement of a student card, you need to report to UM Registry (for undergraduates) or Graduate School (for postgraduate).

學生領袖眼中的紹邦書院——你們是世上的光

首先歡迎新同學們來到澳門大學,加入紹邦書 院的大家庭!

可能每位新同學剛來到澳門大學的時候都會 有疑惑:爲什麽找不到我的宿舍呢?好像學校的地 圖上只出現了學院和書院。

有別於大多數的大學,澳門大學實行住宿式書 院制度。我以前也和各位新同學一樣,對於住宿式 書院是感到陌生的,初來乍到的時候也在疑惑中。 不過,書院的導師們和學長姐們會幫助大家迅速地 融入書院生活之中。而我在紹邦書院生活和學習的

兩年中,它不斷地帶給我自我提升和個人成長。下面就藉由我個人的 經歷,來介紹一下住宿式書院和我們以往的宿舍有什麽分別:

記得院長曾經説過宿舍就是拿來睡覺的,而書院除了睡覺還可以 學習,參加不同類型的活動與鍛煉,開拓視野,認識朋友。

在紹邦書院舉辦的多個長期性的學習項目并不是你們想象中坐在 教室拿起書本學習那樣枯燥乏味,而是通過有趣又有意義的實踐來提 升同學各方面的技能和認知。我自己比較熟知的有五個項目。第一個

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是築夢小隊,它是書院的一個義工小隊,每週定期去幫助本地兒童院 裡需要幫助的小朋友,還會在每年暑假組織去山西的義教活動。第二 是書院的辯論隊,除了在書院裡練習演講和辯論的技巧之外,還會參 加學校裡的比賽,去開拓視野。第三是書院合唱團,這裏不但有很多熱 愛音樂的同學,還時常外出比賽或去聽音樂會。第四是英語桌,大家可 能都知道澳門大學是全英語授課,新同學剛來時難免會有不適應。而 英語桌這裡會有外國人和同學們交流、玩游戲,以幫助大家不斷適應 英語溝通的環境。最後一個是微電影社,喜歡電影的同學能在這裏學 習到製作電影的技能,還能親身體驗拍攝電影的整個流程。

除了以上的長期性學習項目,書院也會根據同學們的不同興趣愛 好來提供游戲、美食、體育、外出交流的機會,例如院生會和樓層舉辦 的游戲、電競、籃球、壁球、剪紙、插花、製作美食、參觀博物館等一 系列活動。當同學們參與自己有興趣的活動時,學習能力、社交技巧、 全球視野都會在無形中提升。這些只是住宿式書院無窮魅力中的冰山 一角,剩下的就需要新同學們自己來體會和探索了。

同學們在書院生活,書院也會提供必要的幫助和舒適便捷的住宿 環境。房間裏有自己的書桌和衣櫃,還有乾净整潔的洗手間。每層樓有 兩個茶水間供同學們製作自己喜歡的食物,還有洗衣機和烘乾機。自 習室可供大家隨時讀書學習。公共空間可用於在學習之餘放鬆自己, 和朋友聊天或看看電影。書院 G 層還包括健身房、琴房和食堂。

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相信大家看完我簡單的介紹,便可以了解到書院和宿舍完全不一 樣。剛剛度過了一個放鬆假期的新同學們必定對大學有著不同的憧憬 和對自己的希望。我希望能用自身的經歷告訴同學們:不要浪費大學 四年,大學沒有管着你的父母和班主任,任何決定都是你自己去選擇, 你可以選擇虛度光陰玩完四年,也可以充實地過完四年,大家都是成 年人,都有自己的想法,希望同學們能做出對自己負責的決定。



享受這裡,改變這裡

親愛的學弟學妹們你們好,恭喜你們進入大 學生活,開啓人生新的旅程!相信你們現在内心 既有期待,也有迷茫,就像當年的我一樣,常常 在思考應該如何度過大學這四年,然而就在思考 的過程中,我的大學生活就不知不覺地結束了。 這四年對我的改變是巨大的,影響是深遠的,但 是作爲畢業生中普通的一員,我不敢說也不會說 什麼樣的大學生活才是完美的,因此,我只想談 談自己的一點感想,希望能帶給你們一些鼓勵和 啓發。

首先,大學和以前任何階段的學習和生活無疑有著很大的差別。 每個人都有自己的時間表, 社交圈變大了, 但是朝夕相處的人變少了, 沒有老師或班長督促大家的學習, 教授似乎更想和學生們成爲朋 友……我個人認爲本科四年對於知識的學習是比較淺層的, 更重要的 是培養快速學習、與人溝通等的軟實力(soft skill)和塑造社會責任感、 領導力等核心品質。這不是説大學的課業就不重要,學習依然是最重 要的事情,只是應該用比以前多很多的時間和精力,通過參加各種各 樣的活動, 主動地鍛煉自己。 爲了給同學們提供鍛煉的機會, 書院可謂 是不遺餘力,長期的、短期的活動五花八門,體育的、義工的、文藝的 不同種類任君選擇。記得我大一那年就參加了二十多個活動,在學長 學姐精心舉辦的這些活動中,我很快適應了書院的生活、找到了自己 的愛好、開拓了視野, 不必變得合群, 但是認識了志同道合的朋友。書 院是澳門大學"四位一體"教育的一部分,在我心目中,它的重要性、 影響力甚至超過學院,所以大家切莫只是把它當作普通的食堂和宿舍, 要好好把握機會鍛煉自己。大學之前的路是別人替你選的、上大學之 後的路你要自己鋪設。參加哪個活動,認識哪些朋友就是你做出的第 一個選擇。

參加活動時,你也許會樂此不疲,也有可能會有失望的心情。紹邦 書院還在成長的初期,還有許多地方可以加以完善,讓書院變得更好。 比如,有的同學興衝衝地去參加了一個活動,卻發現活動和自己的想 象有落差,感到失望,於是便漸漸地開始遲到、缺席、遠離了書院豐富 的生活。這種現象在書院其實并不少見,很少有人會想用自己的行動 去改變,比如自己舉辦一個更有意思的活動,帶給別人好的體驗,相反 更多的人會選擇去抱怨和默默接受現狀。但是,我相信,只有勇敢地去 嘗試、不斷地挑戰自己,我們才會不斷成長,在彼此的奉獻中,書院才 會越來越像一個愛的大家庭。

一直以來,我都希望書院能更有凝聚力和歸屬感,於是在大四最 後一個學期時,我做了一次嘗試,讓書院低年級的同學親手為畢業生 準備畢業禮物,禮物的內容是一個粘有 SPC 乾花滴膠的觸碰燈。一開 始我非常擔心:真的會有同學願意來製作嗎?花了這麼多人力物力的 禮物畢業生會珍惜嗎? 令我意想不到的是,最後在團隊的合作下,我 們號召了 80 名同學,製作了 110 份禮物,每一份禮物都是獨一無二 的,都是飽含祝福的。雖然我不確定這樣一個活動意義到底有多大,但 是看到畢業晚宴上亮起的燈光,看到朋友圈裏有不少同學在曬禮物, 我想只要這件事情能帶給他們內心一點點溫暖就足夠了。我相信,這 一點一點溫暖的堆砌會讓書院變得原來越好,因爲溫暖是可以傳遞的。

總而言之,如果你愛這裏,就盡情地去享受吧!在這片花園裏努 力地吸收陽光、養分,生長成一棵茁壯的小樹。如果你現在不愛這裏, 少一些抱怨,試著去改變吧!這片稚嫩的土地每天都在變得更好。在 付出中你終會成長,也終會愛上! 還記得新生入學典禮上,前校長趙偉博士說了一番話,他說,大學 最重要的一課,是讓人學會 compromise。這番話我思考了很久都無法 理解,現在想來,我以上的一點感想或許就是一種 compromise 吧。

如今我已離開紹邦書院這個愛的港灣,飛向大洋彼岸。但是書院 給我的愛和教育會像一盞燈,永遠陪伴我,照亮我前行的路,也讓我去 帶給這個世界更多美好。
